The State of Connecticut [to pay??] unto Mr. Sharp Rogers

who hath served the Connecticut Line of the Connecticut Army, the

Sum of Thirteen Pounds ten Shill'gs five pence

Being one fourth Part of the Balance found due to him, which Sum shall be paid to him of

his order at the Office, in Gold or Silver, on or before the first Day of June, A.D. One

Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty Seven with Lawful Interest thereof; which Interest

shall be paid unto him or his Order annually at the same Place, on the first Day of June, if

demanded, pursuant to an Act of the General Assembly held at Hartford, the Second

Thursday of May last.
